Although there are no subscription fees, the journal nevertheless requires funding to operate. Thus, income is generated through funding received from California State University, Chico, and through royalties.

Service Suspension of the HEPR Web Site and Job Bank

Alyson Taub and I took a risk in 1996 to offer a web-based resource out of New York University, and have worked for the past seven and a half years to provide a service to the profession. I still believe risk taking using technology in health education in creative ways was and still is essential to move the health education profession forward into an electronic technology-driven society.

HEPR came at a time when our profession really needed a web-based electronic resource for health educators and students to find health education professional information on the web. At the time, there were many consumer health web sites, but no web sites exclusively for health education professional information. There have been countless times when health educators and students have asked me, "Where do I find....?" Also, many health educators were on the move in the 1990s, looking for jobs, yet not knowing how to use the new technology called the Internet to find job announcements. Believe it or not, the hardcopy newspaper was still the medium of choice to find a job rather than accessing online newspapers, journals, and job banks. Thus, we created the HEPR Job Bank, and searched the Internet for job announcements because many job seekers were not as skilled at navigating the Internet.

HEPR from 1996-2003 had over seven million hits, over 24,000 job postings, and at one time, there were over 2,500 hyperlinks. In 2001, my graduate student at Brooklyn College, Larry Wu, completed his master's thesis on health education jobs using data from the HEPR Job Bank and follow-up surveys. The master's thesis was awarded in the M.S. in Computer Science/Health Science degree program (Department of Health and Nutrition Sciences, Brooklyn College, 2900 Bedford Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 11210).
